LIFE'S MOST URGENT QUESTION

Every one of us has heard of JESUS CHRIST. For 2000 years people have been aware of His existence. Many have made up their minds about Him and many have not. And although the years have rolled away the question that Jesus put to the Pharisees, "What do you think of Christ?" comes down to us today as significant as ever Simple though it may seem this is one of the most difficult yet urgent question one person could ask another - for it has eternal consequences. If you ask anyone what he or she thinks of our prime minister or premier they will give you a reply without much hesitation. But if you ask someone what they think of Jesus almost invariably they will hedge and dodge about trying to evade the issue. Yet in the long run it will be of little importance what you think of anyone else. Kings, presidents, generals, archbishops and philosophers come and go and it matters little what we think of them. But every single person must concern himself or herself with JESUS CHRIST. Was He really the Son of God? Did He really leave heaven and come down to earth to seek and to save mankind? Did He really die and rise again? If you want to learn about someone you go to those who were associated with them - their friends, acquaintances and even their enemies. Well let us see what His enemies had to say about Him. Pharisees hated Him but all they could say was, "This man receives sinners." What a charge to bring against Him! He receives sinners! If He had not what would become of us sinners? What else did they say? "He saved others, He cannot save Himself." Yes, He laid down His life for you and me and all mankind. Pontius Pilate tried Him What was his verdict? "I find no fault in Him." Judas Iscariot betrayed Him for 30 pieces of silver. When he saw Jesus was condemned he returned the money to the chief priests and elders saying, "I have sinned in betraying innocent blood" The Roman centurion who had ordered Christ to carry His cross, the nails to be driven into His hands and feet, and the actual crucifixion was compelled to say, "Truly this was the Son of God." There is even the witness of demons In Mark's gospel we read of an unclean spirit that tormented a man crying out, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God?" Many people are under the impression that by believing that Christ is the Son of God they will be saved. But intellectual belief alone will not save anyone. The devils themselves believed as much and they trembled

Then what did His friends say? John the Baptist said: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." When he preached to a great crowd on the day of Pentecost the Apostle Peter exclaimed, "Let all the house of Israel therefore know that God has made Him both LORD and CHRIST, this JESUS whom you crucified." Thomas the disciple doubted until he put his hands in the wounds of the risen Christ, then cried, "My Lord and my God!" After encountering Christ on the road to Damascus Saul of Tarsus endured imprisonments, beatings, stonings, shipwrecks, hunger, hardship and endless toil for Christ. In his last years as Paul the Apostle he wrote, "I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." His testimony also includes this account of early witnesses to His resurrection: "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, was buried and rose again the third day and was seen by Peter, then by the twelve. After that He was seen by over 500 brethren at once after that by James, then by all the apostles Last of all He was seen by me also, as one born out of due time" (1 Cor 15: 3-8) Down through the centuries countless thousands of others have

also confessed their faith in Him as the living, risen Saviour of the world. What about now? Throughout much of the Third World from South America to parts of Asia and Africa millions are following Him. However in our Western world He is largely rejected. In this materialistic, hedonistic age there is no room for Him. We have room for many other things: room for wealth, pleasure and pride; room for business, trade and industry, room for ambition, greed and worry; room for families, friends and finances. The bottom line of the rejection of Christ today is the presence of sin in our personal lives and in society at large. Sin loves the darkness but fears the light. He comes to give light and reveal the world's sin He represents right in a world of wrongs, truth in a world of deceit, justice in a world of injustice, and love in a world of hate. And the world hates Him for it. Yet He cannot be ignored with impunity. He comes to us now as Saviour or later as Judge. The Scriptures assure us that "God has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that JESUS CHRIST is LORD, to the glory of God the Father" (Phil 2. 9 -11) Again we are told that "we must all appear before the judgement seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due to him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad" (2 Cor. 5:10). How, then can we be sure He will not condemn us but be our Advocate at the Divine Tribunal? The Scriptures make it crystal clear Jesus gave the answer to the Jewish elder Nicodemus: "I tell you truly, unless one is born again he cannot enter the kingdom of God." Romans 10:9, 10 tells how: "If you confess with your mouth, JESUS is LORD, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved." Jesus died at the age of 33. Yet of all the armies that ever marched, of all the parliaments that ever sat and all the great men that ever lived none has affected the lives of so many as has this one solitary life. Will you let Him change your life too? What do you think of JESUS CHRIST?
